

CATTLE PRIZE LIST RULES AND REGULATIONS
THEREFORE BINDING ON HANTS COUNTY EXHIBITION

1. **EXHIBITS NOT ADMITTED**: In all cases the right is reserved to reject entirely or to accept conditionally an entry or application. Under no circumstances will animals which are suffering from contagious diseases or articles which are offensive by reason of their odour or appearance or which are dangerous by reason of the combustible or explosive character, be admitted and if such are introduced by an exhibitor, through misapprehension or otherwise, they may be removed by order of the Manager.
2. **ATTENTION TO EXHIBITS**: Exhibitors will, at all times, give personal attention to their exhibits and at the close of the Exhibition take entire charge of same and have attendant in charge of stock to conduct them to the Judge's ring when required.
3. **SAFETY OF EXHIBITS**: Special employees will be in charge and with the aid of Police constables will endeavour to protect property and insure good order. Yet, it must be distinctly understood that the owners themselves must assume the risk. Should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, while the Association will give all the assistance in its power toward the recovery of the same, it will not make any payment for the value thereof.
4. **PROVISIONS FOR LIVESTOCK**: Good buildings are provided upon the grounds for all livestock. All stalls will be well bedded at the opening of the Exhibition.
5. **ANY PERSON WHO SHALL** attempt to interfere with the Judges while in the discharge of their duties, or shall attempt to influence their decisions by his presence or remarks, shall forfeit his right to any prize to which he must otherwise be entitled and be otherwise dealt with as the Committee may determine.
6. **JUDGING RING**: No person will be permitted in the Judging Ring during the time of judging, except the judges, their assistants and the grooms.
7. **TIME LIMIT OF PROTESTS**: All protests must be made in writing and delivered to the Manager, or his assistant, within 4 hours of the cause of the protest, the cause of complaint or appeal must be plainly stated, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00 which sum will be forfeited to the Association if said protest are not sustained. The Board of Directors earnestly hope that exhibitors will not enter protests without the strongest grounds for so doing.
8. **JUDGES AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE** will be furnished with badges to show their official connection with the Exhibition.
9. In all purebred classes, the animals exhibited must be registered in the Canadian National Livestock Records, or Association approved by them, and such registration papers properly transferred to the Exhibitor must be produced when required - Registration Number to be on the entry form. Registration Certificate of Purebred animals must be checked at the time of judging and animals definitely identified before awards are made.

GENERAL:

For purebred classes completed application form, registration paper and performance documents must be available for examination and identification of animals. Papers may be inspected any time during the period on exhibit.

DEFINITIONS:

- a) **EXHIBITOR** - An exhibitor is any breeder or firm which presents animals of farm produce for official placing by a judge at the time specified by the Fair for judging.
- b) **REGISTERED** - Registered means an animal that is purebred of the breed as determined by the by-laws of an association authorized to register animals of that breed.

**Exhibitors are requested to include with each entry a brief description of your farm. This could include acreage, farm name, location, other farming activities or accomplishments. This information will add colour to the exhibitor judging program.

**Award entry fees will be \$15.00 per animal section, fee includes first bedding of sawdust. Each \$45.00 in award entry fees entitles exhibitor to one free 3 day pass. Exhibitors requiring additional passes or those not paying \$45.00 in prize entry fees may purchase a 3 day pass for \$20.00.

c) An award of \$40.00 will be given for each animal shown. There will be no prize money. Some merchandise may be substituted for cash. The Exhibition has budgeted this award prize based on 160 head of beef and dairy cattle. Should more than 160 head be shown the award will be reduced accordingly.

The CCIA has made further changes to the tags that will come into effect on September 1st, 2006. All cattle will have to be tagged with a CCIA approved RFID tag after that date and full enforcement of that policy will commence on December 31, 2007. After January 1, 2008, the current dangle barcode tags will be removed from the list of approved tags.

RFID TAGGING REQUIREMENTS AS OF JULY 1, 2010

All cattle must be tagged with an approved RFID tag. Please leave existing bar-coded tags in animals. Leave the bar-coded tag in and apply an RFID tag to the same animal. Cross-reference the RFID tag with the bar-coded tag in the Canadian Livestock Tracking System (CLTS). Please note: Tampering with and/or cutting out an approved tag is prohibited by regulations. CLASS C - PUREBRED BEEF CATTLE

COMMITTEE: Philip Burgess and Victor Oulton.

ENTRIES CLOSE: August 29th

**All animals must be on the grounds by 9:00 am Friday and remain on the grounds until 5:00 p.m. Sunday of their respective weekends.

**Bulls must have a ring in their nose or be otherwise properly secured to prevent accidents.

**All animals will be inspected for ring worm and mange, infected animals will not be accepted.

**All animals being shown in single sections must be registered at time of closing date of entries, excepting calves, (which must be properly tattooed) in two year and mature cow/calf sections. All animals must be legibly tattooed.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES PER SECTION

The Cow and calf unit is considered as two animals. An Exhibitor may enter as many animals in a Section as he wishes but not more than 9 animals may be entered per exhibitor. Each breed should have 24 head shown to qualify for a show. One entry in Breeders herd and Get of Sire. THE PLACEMENT OF ALL TRIMMING CHUTES MUST BE SUPERVISED BY BEEF COMMITTEE.

CLASS C1 HEREFORD

EXHIBITORS MUST INCLUDE WITH ENTRY A CURRENT LETTER FROM THEIR INSURANCE COMPANY STATING THAT THEY HAVE ONE MILLION DOLLARS (MINIMUM) LIABILITY COVERAGE WHILE ATTENDING THE HANTS COUNTY EXHIBITION. ALL EXHIBITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SIGN A STALL RELEASE FORM WHICH WILL BE PRINTED ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF THE ENTRY FORM.

1. Bull	Born in 2011 - Class will be evenly split for judging if enough numbers in section. Entries must be 3 months of age on day of judging and calves over 6 months must be registered. Calves under 6 months must be properly tattooed.
2. Bull	Born in 2010
3. Female Calf	Born in 2011 - Class will be split evenly for judging if enough numbers in section. Entries must be 3 months of age on day of judging and calves over 6 months must be registered. Calves under 6 months must be tattooed.
4. Female	Born in 2010, after March 31
5. Female	Born in 2010, prior to April 1
6. Female	Born in 2009 - With her own 2010 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot.
7. Female	Born prior to January 1, 2009 - With her own 2011 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot.
8. Breeder's Herd	4 animals, both sexes represented, each animal must have been shown in above classes. At least one animal must be owned by Exhibitor. Animals must be bred by Exhibitor. One exhibit per exhibitor.
9. Get of Sire	3 animals of 1 sire, any age, both sexes exhibited. At least one animal must be owned by the exhibitor, exhibits must have been shown in previous classes. Name and number of sire must be shown on entry form. Ribbons.
10. Progeny of Dam	Two animals progeny of one dam, any age, either sex, owned and bred by exhibitor. Name and number of dam must be shown on entry form. Ribbons.

AWARD ENTRY FEE: \$15.00 per animal, first bedding of sawdust included

ENTRIES CLOSE: August 29th

AWARD: An award of \$40.00 will be given for each animal shown. There will be no prize money. Some merchandise may be substituted for cash. The Exhibition has budgeted this award prize based on 160 head of beef and dairy cattle. should more than 160 head be shown the award will be reduced accordingly.

**Milk will be collected in holding tank courtesy of the Hants County Exhibition. The milk will be picked up by Farmer's Dairy and producers will be compensated. All producers are requested to follow the Rules and Regulations posted.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES PER SECTION

A breeding unit is 10. An exhibitor may enter a maximum of 10 head. Each breed must have 24 head show to qualify for a show.

It is suggested performance data be posted in plain sight at the exhibit stalls.

CLASS D1 - HOLSTEIN

EXHIBITORS MUST INCLUDE WITH ENTRY A CURRENT LETTER FROM THEIR INSURANCE COMPANY STATING THAT THEY HAVE ONE MILLION DOLLARS (MINIMUM) LIABILITY COVERAGE WHILE ATTENDING THE HANTS COUNTY EXHIBITION. ALL EXHIBITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SIGN A STALL RELEASE FORM WHICH WILL BE PRINTED ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF THE ENTRY FORM.

NEW IN 2006: ALL DAIRY EXHIBITORS PRODUCING MILK MUST CARRY LIABILITY INSURANCE TO COVER ANY ACCIDENTAL MILK CONTAMINATION IN THE MILK TANK.

15. **Breeders Herd** (Bred by the Exhibitor). A group of three animals limited per exhibitor. Exhibitor must have bred and own all three animals and own at least three. The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as "breeder" and as "owner".
16. **Best Breed Udder**. Ribbons. Judge shall designate best three udders in Classes 9 - 13. These designated exhibits shall compete for first, second, and third best udders in the show.
17. **Junior Champion Heifer**, Ribbons 1st & 2nd placing in Sections 5 - 8
18. **Junior Herd** - 3 Head
19. **Grand Champion Female**. Ribbon Class.
20. **Get of Sire** (open) 3 animals to be shown. Ribbons.
21. **Progeny of Dam** (open) 2 animals to be shown. Ribbons.

Premier Breeder and Exhibitors award points compiled as follows:

BASICS OF PLACING AWARDS

Atleast 50% to be allotted for general neatness of exhibit and for grooming of animals. The remaining 50% to include courtesy of attendants and information provided by them, as well as other factors to be determined by the Exhibition. Judging to take into account all factors involved in an all-day operation. (7 a.m. to 10 p.m.)
