

SUNSHINE & CHANGE 250 years of AGRI-*culture*

The first agricultural fair in North America took place May 21,1765 at Fort Edward, overlooking fertile Acadian dykeland and the world's highest tides. There was a considerable show of cattle, horses, sheep, and good samples of grain, butter, cheese, and homespun cloth.

Just down the road 250 years later, not much – and everything, has changed. There are still prizes for quality forage at the Hants County Exhibition. Horse and cattle shows now share time with motorsports and the midway, and ox pulls remain popular despite today's demand for instant gratification. Industrious 4-H kids continue to be the heart of exhibition, just as they have for the past 100 years – though craft projects outnumber calf projects. And sunshine continues to be an exhibition's best friend.

Roughly 30,000 visitors come through the gates of the Hants County Exhibition if the weather cooperates. A1996 hurricane brought on the decision to double the odds of a sunny Saturday and Sunday, and change a week long exhibition to one running over two weekends. Next to weather, planning a program that draws a crowd is the greatest chal-





lenge. A Saturday night in 2013 hit the mark, when the "Redneck Olympics" packed exhibition arena. Dave Coombes has seen many big crowds since he was hired as manager fresh out of college in 1965. George Jones, ostrich and pig racing, wrestling, and even soap stars from Another World, drew well throughout the years. But it's harder now. "The challenge, is to invent and implement new twists to sometimes old ideas to create a buzz," he says. "A strong enough buzz to encourage the masses to visit the fair rather than a competing venue."

The directors of the Windsor Agricultural Society in the late 1940's made the courageous decision to purchase land housing a former WWII training facility, and move the Hants County Exhibition from Fort Edward to it's current location. Coombes' father, Herb, was one of those directors. "They met every week," he says. "Dad was a livestock showman. They were all farmers. The

fair, the tradition, was important to them." Shortly after the purchase, a local construction company was tasked with the job of joining two army drill halls to make a 2500 seat arena. Since the early 1950's, exhibition arena and the arena that replaced it after a fire in 1981, has also been the community hockey rink, made available by the society rent free to the Town of Windsor from November to April.

The 41 acre site has 4 acres under cover, as well as Playland, a camp ground, and

parking. There are upwards of 250,000 annual visits to the facility, bringing people into the town of 3,000 almost every weekend. The society generates all operating income through exhibition revenues, facility and equipment rentals.

The volunteer board of 18, led by President Brian Casey, has been busy planning the 250th for several years. Over 70 volunteers make up the many exhibition committees. Along with the manager, there are six seasonal employees, and up to 25 part time employees.


The 250th anniversary celebration has received strong support from Heritage Canada and the province of Nova Scotia. The year kicked off on May 21 by acknowledging and celebrating the Mi'kmaq, African Nova Scotian, and Acadian communities contribution to agriculture with four performances of DRUM!. Also in May, the AgArt Festival showcased agriculture through art and craft.

The 2015 Hants County Exhibition opens Friday, September 18 with "Legends of the Land" – journey through time. cultivation, culture, and community. Throughout the exhibition, special prizes will be offered in competitions including 4-H; tug of war; motorsports;



ox pulls; livestock, and poultry shows, along with many new events and venues, all of which are outlined in this booklet.

The 250th year closes fittingly, with the Nova Scotia Provincial 4-H Show on October 2-4, when the spotlight moves from acknowledging the past, to celebrating the promise of youth, and the future of agriculture. The kids will shine. Hopefully the sun will too.



Commissioned painting celebrates 250 years

To celebrate 250 years, Windsor Agricultural Society commissioned Susan Sweet to create a commemorative painting. Sweet grew up in Martock. The NSCAD educated painter is a life long enthusiast of Hants County Exhibition. Her Dad, Ernest Sweet, was president of the Windsor Agricultural Society during the 200th anniversary year. Oxen are the focal point in the painting. Acadian dykes, that protect fertile farmland, were built with their powerful assistance, restraining the unrelenting tidal waters of the Bay of Fundy system. Oxen still play a key role in the exhibition today. The painting was unveiled May 23 by The Honourable Tony Ince, Minister of Communities, Culture, Heritage, and African Nova Scotian Affairs. Signed, matted, and framed reproductions of the painting are available for sale at the Hants County Local venue at the O'Brien Building during the 250th Hants County Exhibition, at the very reasonable cost of \$75+HST, or at the exhibition office during regular hours. Hants County 4-H at Hants County Exhibition

Hants County 4-H events are happening at various venues throughout the Exhibition.

Hants County 4-H has an exciting program planned for its membership at the Hants County Exhibition and the public is invited to come and see what our 4-H members have learned as they compete in various livestock showmanship and conformation classes, as well as Lifeskills exhibits and competitions... everything from scrapbooking to a fashion show.

In 2015 there are 6 clubs in Hants County with a total enrollment of 276 members, (including 40 Cloverbuds), 105 generous and dedicated volunteer leaders and members are involved in just over 530 individual projects. Members enroll in a wide variety of projects and in 2015 members in Hants County could choose from 38 different livestock and lifeskill projects.

4-H members are not only involved in their individual clubs but also in their communities, as they complete community service in a variety of ways. 4-H members also represent their clubs at the Hants County Exhibition competing to attend the Nova Scotia Provincial Show. Members participate within the county at Royalty competitions and public speaking events. Many members attend Camp Rankin on an annual basis as well as competing in woodsmen and Tug-of-War Competitions.

Charlie Levy – Exhibition Hero



Charlie Levy has been coming to the Hants County Exhibition since he was old enough to walk. In those days, animals were led to the exhibition at Fort Edward. In 2014 he won the Hants County Exhiition pleasure driving division, and the championship cooler.

Like so many events and festivals, exhibitions are dependent on volunteers. Thousands of "invisible" hours are spent behind the scenes. Without the service of people like Charlie Levy, there would be no exhibition.





EXHIBITIONA life's work

It is said that as long as you love what you do, you will never work a day in your life. For fifty years Dave Coombes has been managing the oldest fair in North America.

Coombes grew up at Castle Frederick, Upper Falmouth. Like many Canadian farm boys he

worked along side his Dad, went through 4-H, and played hockey. He didn't have much of an interest in school, but after a couple of years working on the farm, school looked more appealing. He enrolled at the Nova Scotia Agricultural College, where he was class valedictorian. He went on to MacDonald College, at McGill in Montreal to complete his B.Sc in Agriculture, graduating in 1965.

In that year, Coombes was president of College Royal, and he and Frances welcomed their first of two daughters. Theirs was a true 4-H love story. They met when Frances Davis and her Holstein calf finished first, just ahead of Coombes and his Hereford calf, to claim 4-H Grand Champion Showman.

The young family headed back to Nova Scotia, settling briefly in Truro where Coombes took a job as Ag Rep in Colchester County. Watson Maxner, the Hants County Exhibition manager at the time was ready to retire and in August of the 200th anniversary year, Coombes moved home to become the new manager. Maxner, also manager of the Atlantic Winter Fair, passed away suddenly between the two exhibitions, and Coombes found himself in that position as well. For much of his working career he managed Nova Scotia's three major exhibitions and exhibition facilities, adding the Nova Scotia Provincial Exhibition to the list in the 80s and 90s.

Never one to shy away from controversy, he saw a financial opportunity in his early years with the AWF and developed the first casino, and first major lottery in Nova Scotia

- Ex Hi Lotto. Church groups and the public, including his own mother, were outraged. Both made money. Soon after, the provincial government recognized a good thing, stepped in and took over the lottery. It was not uncommon in those days for the AWF to be the subject of the Chamber's editorial cartoon in the Chronicle Herald. Those were good days for the exhibition business.

Along the way he was President of the Livestock Council of Nova Scotia, President of Nova Scotia Hereford breeders, and President of the Canadian Exhibition Association. In 1980 he was named Canadian Fair Manager of the Year.

In the 80's he oversaw the construction of Exhibition Park, the new home of the Atlantic Winter Fair after it's move from the Halifax Forum. Ironically the Forum, still in



use today, was considered old and in need of being torn down. Exhibition Park and the AWF thrilled the local horse community by hosting the \$100,000 DuMaurier Cup, drawing big name competitors from across North America to Halifax each October for the word class show jumping event. In 1999, the Nova Scotia Government took over Exhibition Park from the Board of Directors. The grand days of the prestigious livestock event were over and the Atlantic Winter Fair was no more.

When he wasn't working, Coombes hauled his girls

and their ponies around. He continued to play hockey into his sixties, giving it up when he started exploring the world. He has visited five of the seven continents – traveled the Silk Road from Ubekistan, climbed Machu Pichu, walked the Great Wall of China, and experienced a world of contrast in South Africa. He saw the pyramids of Egypt, and in 2009 marveled at the wonder of Petra in Jordan, with his granddaughter.

Coombes has been a sound financial exhibition manager, being both creative and frugal, during a challenging time for agricultural exhibitions. The choice to make exhibitions his life's work was an easy one — exhibition is in his blood. Father Herb was a long time director of the Windsor Agricultural Society. The elder Coombes brought up his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren with the philosophy that as long as there was an exhibition to attend, there was no need to be in school. His photo hangs along with the other presidents in the O'Brien Building. You only need to scan the wall to realize why exhibitions matter.



The 38th NS 4-H Show will be held on October 2-4, 2015 at the Hants County Exhibition Grounds. This is the largest independent 4-H Show in Canada and it provides an excellent opportunity for the public to experience the 4-H youth leadership program in an interactive way. The first NS show was held in Windsor in 1977, thus it is fitting that the NS Show returns to the grounds as they celebrate their 250th anniversary.

4-H Show

At the provincial event 40 projects, 90 classes and 2400 entries are expected to be displayed. Highlights of the Nova Scotia 4-H Show include livestock auctions, fashion show, dog handling, tug of war, grand champion showmanship and dairy and beef cattle selections for the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto.


