Those wishing to enter the vegetable classes are requested to complete an entry form and send the form to the Exhibition Office. Your entry will be processed and tags are available for pick up. Exhibitors living close by are encouraged to pick up tags during office hours prior to Exhibition. Those unable to pick up tags early may do so when you bring your entries to place in the Exhibition. **PLEASE REMEMBER YOU MUST COMPLETE YOUR ENTRY FORM AND RETURN BY ENTRY CLOSING DATE SO THAT YOUR ENTRIES MAY BE PROCESSED.** Grounds and buildings will be open to Exhibitors on Thursday, September 11th in order that they may bring in and arrange their exhibits.

ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 9:00 A.M. FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 12th. POSITIVELY NO EXHIBITS WILL BE RECEIVED AFTER THAT HOUR.

No Exhibitor may receive more than ONE prize in any one section. All produce must be grown in the current year and all exhibits must be grown upon the premises of the exhibitor. This does not apply to children who may enter exhibits grown upon the premises of the parent or guardian. The Committee has the right to eject any exhibit which they feel may not have been grown on the property. Each produce where required must be correctly named as to variety. Sheaves of grain to be not less than 3 inches or more than 4 inches in diameter at the tie. Uniformity and smoothness will always be considered in judging carrots, parsnips, beets and turnips for table use. Peas and beans on plates must be fresh and ready for table use.
