Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles:

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

GENERAL AND COMPETITION REGULATIONS AND RULES

Applicable EC Rule Book references are sometimes noted but are not a substitute for knowledge of the Rule Book itself.

1) MEMBERSHIPS:

- a. All Canadian owners and riders must have a valid EC Gold Sport License (A205); OR purchase a Single Event Upgrade (A211) or License Transfer (A212) for a Silver or Bronze Sport License to Gold License; OR purchase a Temporary Sport License. (A208 – not eligible for points)
- b. Competitors also require provincial territorial sport organization (PTSO) membership.
- c. All athletes and owners must be holders of a current membership in their home country's national federation, and foreign entries must sign an affidavit.
- d. All athletes competing in Amateur classes must possess a valid EC Amateur Card and must present it to the Competition Secretary upon request. (A902)
- e. Exception: Lead line riders who require only a NSEF or other PTSO membership.
- f. Please be aware that NSHJA membership is required to participate and/or benefit in the NSHJA Pro-grams.

Article A602.7: Per Article A801, every entry at an Equestrian Canada sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EQUESTRIAN CANADA constitution and all rules of EQUESTRIAN CANADA and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EQUESTRIAN CANADA sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EQUESTRIAN CANADA constitution and the applicable rules of EQUESTRIAN CANADA and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. **Do not participate in this EQUESTRIAN CANADA sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EQUESTRIAN CANADA and any additional rules imposed by the competition.**

INSURANCE: PTSO Membership, OR \$2 Million 3rd party liability for out of province is required. There is no temporary NSEF membership.

MEDICATION CONTROL FEE OF \$7.00: Any horse entered in any EQUESTRIAN CANADA class at a competition may while on the competition grounds be selected for Equine Medication Control Testing. Art. A602.5

EQUESTRIAN CANADA PASSPORTS: Article A402, A404 & G110. Required for Horses & Ponies entered in over fence classes; to be passed in to Show Office when picking up ring numbers and picked up when ring numbers are returned. If no passport one must purchase a Temporary Horse Registration at a cost of \$45.00. (A411.3) Not eligible for EQUESTRIAN CANADA points. A valid EQUESTRIAN CANADA Horse License is required. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (A404).

All SCHOOLING RULES: FEI scoring rules will apply.

AMATEUR RIDERS must have current credentials - Article A902, G108

HEADGEAR - Art. G102, A905, G1103, G1104, G401.5 & G1004 - Protective headgear must be worn. While riding anywhere on the grounds harnesses must be secured, properly fitted and fastened. Juniors MUST have ASTM/BSI approved headgear (with SEI seal).

PONY MEASUREMENTS: (A1102-1104, G111) will be held in the main barn before the first pony class. Information will be posted in the office.

COMPETITION NUMBERS: A603.h: A reminder that competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. See article A814, Identification Number.

STALLIONS: G105 & A811 – Junior's may not ride or handle stallions anywhere on the competition grounds. Manageable stallions ridden by seniors are eligible for all senior classes.

COMPETITION RULES: Every EQUESTRIAN CANADA class offered herein is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current rules of the EQUESTRIAN CANADA Rule Book and will be held and judged in accordance with said rule book. Cross entering is permitted in all divisions providing all EQUESTRIAN CANADA Rules are followed including eligibility. The Hants County Exhibition has the right to refuse entry. For issues not covered by EQUESTRIAN CANADA rules the Hants County Exhibition Show Committees decision will be final.

HORS CONCOURS: ARE not permitted. Art. G201.3, G401.7 Jumper G501.

ENTRIES: Entries must be received by September 8, 2016. Class fees are payable before numbers can be issued. Incorrectly completed entry forms will result in an extra charge per entry form for processing. Entries may be faxed to 1-902-798-2999 and paid for by Cheque, Visa or Mastercard or cash. Please note this on your entry form and note the name in which your card is registered, the card number and expiry date. **ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNTIL PAID IN FULL.**

Exhibitors are responsible for their own mistakes when filling in entries. Horses will not be permitted in the ring unless entries are paid in full.

Unless otherwise specified, all classes will proceed by posted order of go. If a rider or trainer foresees a problem they must contact the horse show office. The competition Managers decision will be final.

STALL FEES: Box Stall \$25.00 for any part of a 24 hour period. Straight Stall: (Draft Horse Barn) \$12.00 for a 24 hour period. All parking of horse trailers will be outside the fenced grounds area.

Emergency Contact Information: All stalls require a contact number posted on the stall in case of any emergency.

ENTRY TRANSFERS: The exhibitor must follow the proper procedure of scratching the existing division/class and entering a new division/class with the show secretary. Transfer of fees will only be allowed among horses under the same ownership.

Hunter Divisions are made up of three classes. Championships awarded as per Article A703, A706, A707, A709, G203, G204, G205 and G206. All horses/ponies must be in holding area before class begins; failure to comply will result in elimination. Competitors must remain in the ring until ribbons have been presented and are required to be in show ring attire, with horses in bridles for presentations or Prize Money, ribbons and placing will be forfeited (G109 & G202).

Please Note: The Show Management reserves the right to cancel or combine any given class that does not fill to their satisfaction. Any class or division that does not have at least 4 entries at least 12 hours before the 1st class is scheduled may be cancelled and notice posted in the Light Horse Office.

DISCLAIMER: The Hants County Exhibition Horse Show, it's Management, Organizing Committee, Officials or Show Staff, Volunteers are in no way responsible for accidents, injury or damage to any rider, exhibitor, spectator, groom, attendant, trainer or other employee; or animals, nor theft, loss or damage to animals, vehicles or equipment.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries; disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibiting of entries; cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course; to cancel or combine any unfilled classes or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors.

REFUNDS: Cancellation by WRITTEN NOTICE signed by the Exhibitor must be received by the Horse Show Secretary and the Exhibitor must confirm receipt of notice.

Before Closing Date – Before closing date (September 8, 2016) of entries, a full refund will be given.

After Closing Date but before the start of the Show – Stall fees will not be refunded and the stall shall revert to the Exhibition for reassignment, without any compensation. NO STALL shall be assigned to any other party by anyone other than the Stall Manager. The Show Secretary must receive a WRITTEN CERTIFICATE OF HORSE OR PONY DISABILITY FROM A VET AT THE TIME OF CANCELLATION. The entry fees will be refunded, minus stall fees and the current office fee or 15% whichever is greater by cheque within twenty-one (21) days of the completion of the show.

Cancellations for any other reason are not entitled to a refund. Illness of rider does qualify for a refund.

Upon submission of a written certificate of disability from a veterinarian, one (1) horse may be substituted for an injured horse. All stall fees and entry fees will be applied to the new horse. The new entry will incur a \$20 substitution fee, but no late fee will be charged.

CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS: Exhibitors must enter the ring for all classes in the division to be eligible for Championship Award.

DRESS CODE: Jumper competitors are required to wear jackets in ALL jumper classes. Hunter and Hack divisions required jackets.

COOLER PRESENTATIONS: Championship and Reserve Awards for all classes will be presented following the last class in the division. Winners must present themselves in full ring attire. Hunter horses must be in show bridle. Failure to appear for presentation will result in forfeiture of prize money and championship award.

PASSES: Two three (3) day passes per horse or pony. Extra three (3) day passes may be purchased.

SHOW OFFICE HOURS: WILL BE POSTED, typically the horse show office will be opened one hour before the start of the competition and remain open for 30 minutes following the last class.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

PARKING OF HORSE TRAILERS: Please check with show office for directions and park under the direction of the parking attendant. See special instructions on entry form.

HUNTER & HACK DIVISIONS: Horses may arrive on Wednesday, September 21, 2016 after 8:00 a.m. and depart promptly after their last class. Practice time available after 9:00 a.m. Wednesday @ \$80.00 per hour. Practice times must be booked by email: hantscountyex@eastlink.ca. Hunter classes will commence on Thursday morning. Stalls must be picked out clean upon departure and manure placed on manure pits.

JUMPER DIVISION: Horses may arrive after 2:00 p.m. on Friday, September 23, 2016 and depart after last class.

SPECIAL CAMPER TRAILER INSTRUCTIONS

NO CAMPER TRAILERS are to be parked in the regular trailer parking area without supervision. Trailers may be delivered to grounds early and temporarily parked in a designated holding area and then parked with supervision during required hours.

TRAILER HOOKUPS: Please book with entry. \$15.00 per night. See trailer parking directions on entry form.

The medal class is open to EC amateurs and junior riders with a 2016 NSHJA Membership. NSHJA ribbons will be awarded for 1st to 8th at each competition and points accumulated for year-end championship and reserve championship ribbons. Class Specifications: Non EC Rated. The course will be a modified hunter style medal course at 3' and open to junior and amateur riders. The same horse must be used for O/F and the flat phase. Judge may test the top four riders, no tack changes. Open numerical scoring.
