You will then be able to enter your article for competition. Local Exhibitors are urged to visit the Exhibition Office and pick up tags to speed up the entering process. This may be done during regular office hours Monday through Friday. All entries are to be posted on your entry forms with your name and address, class and section written on back of each.

**NOTE:** The Committee cannot be responsible for pictures submitted, but every effort will be made to assure the safe return of the same.

#### **RULES**

IMPORTANT: ANY PERSON WHO HAS RECEIVED PAYMENT FOR THEIR PHOTOGRAPHY WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED AN AMATEUR AND THEREFORE THEIR ENTRIES WILL BE REFUSED. Photos must have been taken in the past 12 months. No repeat entries.

The printing and developing is optional. NO DARK ROOM SPECIAL WORK IS TO BE DONE. No studio photographs will be accepted. Digital photos properly printed on photo quality paper will be accepted. All exhibits must be mounted on card stock or similar material, no mounting on plastic, thick cardboard or foam and no commercial matting. **ALL PHOTOS MUST HAVE A 1/2 INCH BORDER AROUND PICTURE**. Photos not to exceed 4" x 6" to 5" x 7". One entry per section per exhibitor. **STAPLES** are **not** to be used when attaching entry tags to photos as they will scratch other photos. Entries of exhibitors using staples will be refused.
